

D'Evelyn Jr./Sr. High School Behavioral Contract

The D'Evelyn Jr./Sr. High School standards for behavior are designed to influence students for life, not simply to curb undesirable behavior while attending school. The standards in this contract will apply to the entire community at the school. Staff members, parents, and students are to be positive examples while on campus or at any school sponsored event.

Honesty, compassion, self-control, responsibility, and courtesy are character traits that are valued and expected. These character traits demonstrate respect for authority, self, others, and others' ideas. This includes respectfully confronting someone with whom we have a problem, with the goal of finding a solution. Maintaining these traits creates the atmosphere necessary to support academic excellence.

Student infractions will be dealt with promptly so that disruptions will be minimized and expectations clearly upheld. Teachers are responsible for monitoring and keeping classroom order. The administration will deal with all instances of unacceptable behavior in accordance with school policy, district policy and applicable laws.

The following list is an example of unacceptable behaviors. The list is illustrative and should not be considered exhaustive.

- Defiance of insubordination, failure to comply with a reasonable request by any adult
- Causing classroom or school activity disruption
- Cell phone out during class time.
- Leaving campus during the school day without permission from parent/guardian and the school administration
- Possession of illegal drugs, alcohol, tobacco/nicotine, marijuana, or sexually explicit materials on campus or at school-related events
- Inappropriate public display of affection
- Profanity
- Inappropriate or immodest dress (compliance with the dress code required)
- Cheating/Plagiarism
- The use of AI to generate work as a replacement for work students are supposed to authentically create will be considered plagiarism.
- Truancy or tardiness (If tardy, students are expected to scan into the QR code system before entering their classroom.3 Tardies=detention).
- Physical or verbal abuse
- Violation of driving policy
