Student Council Update – Hailee Lansville

- Movie night will be held the night of November 11th (students grade 7-12 can attend the movie night while the DEF Dinner is going on). Movie will be Home Alone.
- Wish week was held during homecoming week. The final donation was a little over \$5000 and was recently sent to the recipient.
- Student Council will partner with Spanish Honor Society at the upcoming movie night to collect cans for a canned food drive. The price of admission to the movie night will be 2 cans or a \$3 donation to be used towards the purchase of additional canned food.
- Trick-or-Treat Street and the Improv Show raised money for the Tennyson Center. Approximately \$1,600 was raised.

Study Skills Presentation – Leslie Berlinberg (ClubZ Tutoring)

- Academic concerns can stem from a variety of root causes (low grades, high memorization classes, forgetting to turn in work, low motivation, low test scores, poor grades in math, test anxiety, poor study skills)
- One issue might include forgetting to turn in work or low motivation. One idea is to use a time card to have the student track the homework that is turned in. Another idea is to make sure the student is using their daily planner. Planning ahead (aka backward planning) in the planner can help avoid procrastination.
- Another issue might be test grades that are significantly lower than homework grades. Make sure the student is digging deeper with their studying and homework, make corrections on the homework, talk to the teacher, study notes on a daily basis and follow up with the teacher if there are any questions, use 7th hour, peer tutoring, meet with the teacher, complete end of chapter review questions
- Most children don't want their parents involved in their daily work. The provided handouts can be given to the student to problem solve on their own.
- Note taking issues talk to the teacher about possible solutions such as copying teacher notes, copying another students notes, record the lecture, information on the website
- Find a way to motivate your student if he/she has lost motivation. This can be praise, a privilege, a treat, etc... You can also find a larger goal, such as Honor Roll, certain GPA, etc... and talk about the way to get there.

- Test anxiety the more the student is prepared the less anxious he/she will be. Make sure the student is familiar with the material. Use a special item during the test (special pen, worry stone, etc...). There are also techniques on "how to take a test" that can make the test situation less stressful.
- No phones during studying too much of a distraction
- Note cards can be very useful they can break the information down into smaller units that are easier to remember
- Study smarter, not harder
