- Vast majority of funding comes from state or local taxes.
- Mill levy increases pay for enhancements to operations
- Bonds allow a district to buy, maintain and upgrade real property
- Constitutional amendments have impacted school funding. Amendment 64 (marijuana sales) has not fixed the school funding issue Tabor Amendment - limits revenues and requires voter approval for tax increases
- Gallagher Amendment- decreased amount of revenue that can come from local taxes on residential property; in combination with TABOR Since 1983 our per pupil state funding has decreased (when compared to other states
- Since 2009 state and local funding combined has fallen relative to the rate of inflation
- Amendment 23 guaranteed a minimum level of funding for education. However, it did not undo the earlier amendments or include sufficient funding mechanisms, so the issue was kicked back into the legislature. The legislature

has been unable to fund education at a pace that meets inflation, as Amendment 23 intended.

- Upcoming ballot issues:
 - Jeffco Question 5A Mill Levy increase to support operations. \$33M mill levy override. \$2.10/month increase per \$100K in residential value.
 - Jeffco Question 5B \$567 bond to address capital construction.
 - Amendment 73 state-wide. Dedicates a 3rd stream of tax revenue to schools and is estimated to bring an additional \$1609 per pupil annually to Jeffco schools. It needs 55% of the voters statewide to pass.
- There is a letter signed by 42 D'Evelyn staff members asking Accountability members to commit to investigating these issues further in order to make an educated vote. Asks for a motion to distribute the information and letter.
- Motion is made to use our email distribution list and the Jaguar Tracks to provide the presentation and the letter from D'Evelyn staff. Motion is seconded. Motion is approved.
